SCSD 2022-23 Return Overview and Federal Stimulus Safe Return/Continuity of Services and ESSER III funds

The following is posted as a requirement of the American Rescue Plan Act for the City of St. Charles School District to qualify for federal funding that is part of the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER III).

During the 2021-22 school year, the City of St. Charles School District provided both uninterrupted in-person and virtual instruction for our community. The district's primary objective for the 2022-23 school year is to continue normal school operations.

For the 2022-23 school year, the district's goals are:

- Create and implement a Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity(SRCSP) of Services Plan. This plan will include information on:
 - Continuing in-person (5-day week) instruction as the district did for the 2021-22 school year
 - Providing the option for a state-approved virtual learning programming available for students
 - Determined through an application/collaborative process as appropriate to meet the needs of the student.
 - Continuing to provide appropriate accommodations to students that are mandated by their IEPs.
 - Utilizing and revising the <u>2023-23 Entry Plan</u> for a safe continuation of in-person learning for the 2022-23 school year.
 - All health protocols will be decided through collaboration and the delineation of recommondations with/from health agencies/partners (SCCDPH, DESE, DHSS, and CDC).
- Consulting with students, families and staff via district communication avenues about distribution of ESSER III funds
- Periodic reviews and revisions to the SRCSP, primarily through superintendent comments/updates at Monthly BOE meetings

The City of St. Charles School District will inform and update our students, staff, parents and community on the SRCSP (available in English & Spanish, other languages per request) via district communication avenues such as our website, social media accounts, emails, podcast, etc. Input from our community, Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and governing health officials will help guide any changes made to the plan during the 2022-23 school year.
